Prof. Norma Sharp - soprano



Prof. Norma Sharp was born in USA and studied singing and musicology at the University of Kansas. In Germany she continued her studies with Prof. Helmut Melchert in Hamburg and Prof. Peter Witsch in Cologne. Following contracts in major opera houses in Germany, she joined the en-

semble of the Badisches Staatstheater Karlsruhe. Since then she has worked as a freelance musician, appearing as a guest on many European stages. As a lyric and jugendlich-dramatisch soprano. Mozart and Strauss roles are an important part of her repertoire. At La Scala Milan she made her debut as the Countess in "The Marriage of Figaro". Guest contracts took her to the Deutsche Staatsoper Berlin, the Semperoper in Dresden, Hannover, Stuttgart, Amsterdam, Antwerp, Ghent, Zurich, Basle, Berne, Geneva, Rome, Naples, Madrid, Glasgow, London, Paris, Prague and Budapest. She has performed at the Bayreuth Festival. the Glyndebourne Festival, the Ludwigsburger Schloßfestspiele and the Handel Festival in Karlsruhe. In recitals Norma Sharp likes to concentrate on the German Romantic repertoire as well as several contemporary composers. Her accompanists are Irwin Gage, Wilhelm von Grunelius and Wolfram Rieger. She has given concerts with the conductors Horst Stein. Marek Janowski. Giuseppe Sinopoli, Carlo Maria Giulini, Pierre Boulez and Neville Marriner, Recordings and TV performances document her performing career. Since 1992 Norma Sharp has been Professor of Singing at the Academy of Music Hanns Eisler Berlin.

Timothy Sharp - baritone



Timothy Sharp was born in Augsburg, Germany. He studied at the Hochschule für Musik "Hanns Eisler", Berlin, in Professor Norma Sharp's class, and participated in numerous master classes with Hans Hotter, Brigitte Fassbaender, Peter Schreier and Dietrich Fischer

-Dieskau. He has won prizes at several national and international competitions and has become an acclaimed singer of lieder. Engagements as a soloist in oratorios and symphonic concerts took him to major German venues in Berlin, Munich, Stuttgart, Essen or Frankfurt am Main. Since 2006 he has sung in concerts with Nikolaus Harnoncourt at the Styriarte, the Musikverein in Vienna, in Salzburg, in Leipzig (Thomaskirche), in Metz (Arsenal) or Paris (Salle Plevel).

His debut CD "Nacht und Träume" - Songs by Franz Schubert - has been released in 2006. Since 2010 Timothy Sharp has been a teacher at Musikhochschule München.
